QUICK TIPS & NOTES

* Hardship Progeny Registration is offered for foals born to a parent prior to the postmark date of the application for [hardship registration of the parent](#).
 * Any prior offspring, two years old or younger, of any hardshipped horse will be eligible for applying for [Hardship Progeny registration](#) provided both parents are AMHA registered at the time of application for registration. Must be [parent qualified by DNA testing](#), inspected by an [AMHA Carded Judge](#); Measurement by a [current AMHA Carded Steward or past or present AMHA Director](#) with a current certified measurement card. Must be at show height requirements at the time of inspection and any other hardship requirements as well as regular registration requirements.

* A late or amended [stallion breeding report](#) will be required.

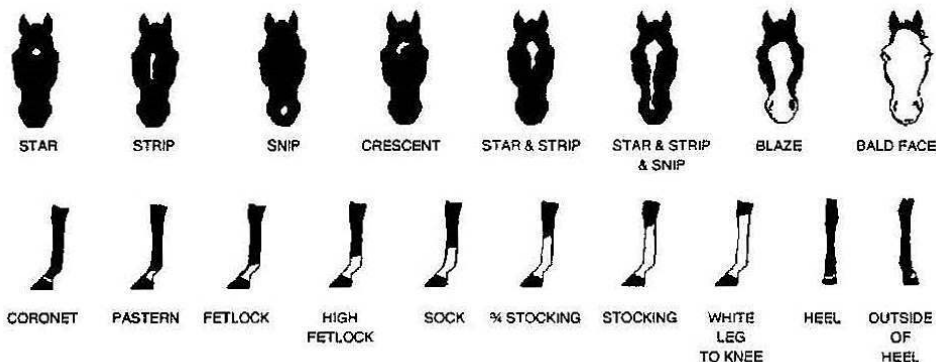
INSTRUCTIONS

SECTION 1 - REGISTRATION APPLICATION	* No boxes should be left blank. * BOTH SIRE AND DAM MUST BE REGISTERED WITH AMHA. * Application for Registration MUST BE MADE BY AND THE HORSE MUST BE REGISTERED TO THE OWNER(S) OF RECORD OF THE DAM AT THE TIME OF FOALING. If it is not, you will need to make the necessary Transfers . * Even if sire/dam are TEMPORARILY REGISTERED and not ELIGIBLE for permanent status, their current heights must be provided.
SECTION 2 - SERVICE/BREEDERS CERTIFICATE	* This section must be completed, or a Service Certificate attached, UNLESS the person registering the horse owned the sire AND dam at time of service.
SECTION 3 - OWNERSHIP TRANSFER AND HEIGHT CERTIFICATION	* This section to be completed ONLY if ownership is to be transferred at the time of registration. * Height certificate must be completed by both buyer and seller if ownership is being transferred at time of registration. * Please note that a transfer fee applies to this option. See Work Order for current fees.

COMMON COLORS AND MARKINGS & HOW TO MEASURE

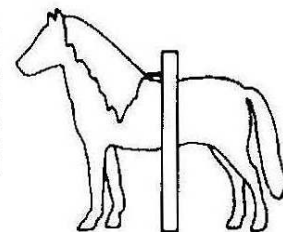
BAY	Chestnut or sorrel with black mane & tail and black points.	CREMELLO	Creamish body and points. Must have blue eyes.	PERLINO	Creamish body, points very slightly darker. Must have blue eyes.
BLACK	Black, usually black eyes, hoofs and skin, points always black.	DUN	Any body color, with usually darker mane and tail. True Duns must have a dorsal line back and usually zebra markings at the knees and hocks.	ROAN	May be red, black, or bay body color with about 50% white hairs intermingled. Points usually much darker. Adult color does not get lighter with age.
BROWN	Sometimes difficult to distinguish from black or dark bay, but flank and muzzle usually lighter.	GREY	Usually born a darker color, gradually turning white with age.	SILVER DAPPLE	Body color ranges from light milk chocolate to almost black with silver dapples, the mane and tail are silver to white.
BUCKSKIN	Tannish to yellow body color with black mane, tail and lower legs.	GRULLO	Smooth grayish-blue color like a mouse - not a blue roan - always has black mane & tail, usually black lower legs.	SORREL	Reddish or copper red; mane & tail usually same color, may be flaxen.
CHESTNUT	Dark mahogany red or dark reddish-brown, mane & tail usually same color, may be flaxen.	PALOMINO	Light yellow to bright gold. Must have white mane and tail.	WHITE	Snow white. Usually has pink skin.

MEASURING A MINIATURE HORSE

The height of a miniature horse is the vertical distance from the last hairs of the mane to the ground when the animal is standing squarely on a level area.
